A full refund will be made if a booking with payment is cancelled by telephone within 7 days of the booking being made. In other circumstances, a full or partial refund will only be made if there is a sufficient number of members on the trip to cover the costs. A refund of ticket costs can only be made where either the ticket has not yet been purchased or the ticket is sold to another member. Refunds - All refunds will be made after the theatre event/outing has taken place. Guest policy - Non-members can come on a theatre event/outing as a guest of a member on **one occasion only**.
